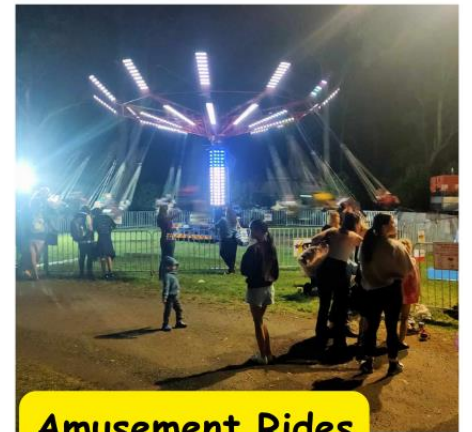

### A Brief History of the Tamborine Mountain Show Grounds

The Tamborine Mountain Showgrounds and A H & I Society were born from the need of the growing community of Tamborine Mountain for both a Recreation Ground and an Agricultural Show. A meeting of interested residents convened on 14th September 1928 to consider two pieces of land, with the block offered by the trustees of the Davidson Estate deemed the most suitable. The option was presented to a meeting of the residents of South Tamborine the following Tuesday who confirmed the decision. A Committee was immediately appointed to oversee the purchase and development of the site, and thus the Tamborine Mountain A H & I Society was formed. The sum of £27/6/- was raised by public subscription towards the purchase of the land. By the end of the following year, the full debt of £162 had been paid. Sports Days and gatherings such as dances quickly become regular events at the grounds. Whilst the newspaper reports would indicate that the first Show was in 1930, a photograph held by the Library of Queensland is described as being taken at the first Tamborine Mountain Show in 1929 and that the venue was the Zamia Theatre. The Pavilion at the Grounds is the original Soldiers Memorial Hall, opened on 1st October 1932 by Mr Jason Sharp of the Canungra RSSILA. It was the first Memorial Hall to be dedicated in the Shire. Its opening coincided with the 1932 Show, with the paper reporting a good crowd, and gate takings of £20.

Except for some years around the time of the wars, and in the Year of COVID, the Show has been a constant tradition on the Mountain. These past years have seen an enormous amount of change, both on the Mountain and within the Show. The Tamborine Mountain A H & I Society looks forward to bringing you the 2025 Tamborine Mountain Show.

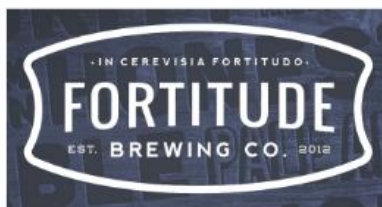
3. The Committee reserves the right to cancel or refuse any entry and advise of the reasons.

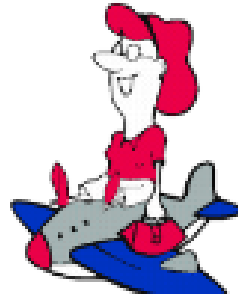

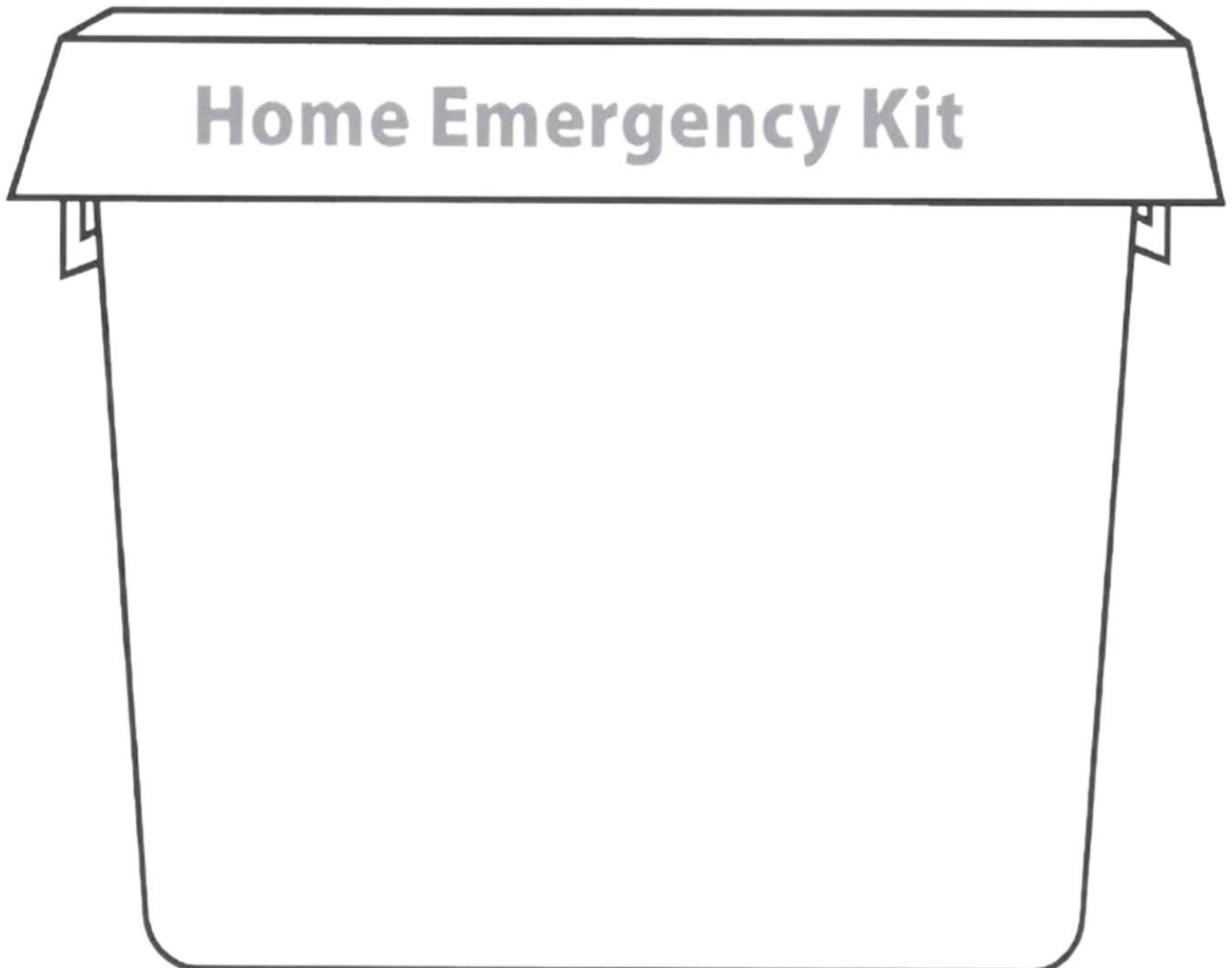
